# MASTER OF SCIENCE IN EDUCATION

Teaching Students with Disabilities / All Grades – for Career Changers

This 47-credit degree graduate program combines virtual and online courses over 5 semesters of full-time study, or students may choose to study part-time. The program focuses on the needs of career changers, developing high performing, skilled, and passionate educator-practitioners of Pre-K-12 students with disabilities. Up to 6 credits may be transferred upon review of your transcript

The **Master of Science in Education for Career Changers, Teaching Students with Disabilities, All Grades**, consists of seven core courses (21 credits); five general education courses in math, science, language, and literacy specific to teaching students with diverse learning needs (17 credits); one semester of student teaching (6 credits); and a capstone research seminar (3 credits).
